

OBSTACLES TO EXCELLENCE:

- 1) Achievement/Opportunity Gap African American children, on average,
 score lower on tests and are given
 lower grades than Asian, White, and
 Latino students.
- 2) **Drop-outs** In adolescence, academic and personal challenges cause Black students to consider dropping out of school.
- 3) **Discipline** Black students are more likely to be suspended or expelled than their white counterparts.



OBSTACLES TO EXCELLENCE:

- 4) **Expectations** Historically, educational systems have created environments where lowered expectations have been placed on Black students
- 5) **Staffing** Teacher/Staff skills, cultural awareness and performance shows major vulnerabilities in how they interact with Black students.

Intentional call-out of our internal dilemma;
Development of BSA Advisory
Committee; Allocation of \$750,000 charge to develop Black Student Achievement Initiative

DO

The creation of programs and experiences that enrich the experience of Black students (e.g. Sankofa Summer, Math Collaborative, HBCU support)

STUDY

Intentional analyzing and use of data to identify areas of need and a set of plans and actions that will be taken to address these needs.

ACT

Creation of a plan that addresses needs, creates measurable goals (incl. accountability), and allows LBUSD to monitor / adjust as needs change and as the community offers feedback.



BLACK STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT INITIATIVE

In the 2021-22 Learning Acceleration and Support Plan, LBUSD announced plans to allocate funds (\$750,000) to develop and engage a Black Student Achievement Advisory Committee to recommend additional supports for Black students.

Sankofa Summer Academy: A Transformational Experience


- Culturally relevant & sustaining instruction, social emotional learning skills, mentorship, and enrichment



- Sankofa Summer Academy A summer school academic enrichment program for rising 4th/5th graders
- Sankofa Saturdays An academic enrichment program centered on an assets-based study of black excellence promoting positive identity development.
- ☐ Sankofa After School Students will participate in a program that is an extension of the Sankofa Saturday programming.
